Required Prerequisites: Individuals must complete the IS-100.c Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-200.c Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, IS-700.b An Introduction to the National Incident Management System and the IS-800.c National Response Framework, an Introduction courses. In addition, G300 Intermediate courses prior to attending the G400 Advanced course and provide copies of their certificates of completion to the instructors on day one of the course.
