Course Description: This 2-day intermediate-level L146 Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) course is designed to provide a set of guiding principles, standardized methodology, available resources and practical skill development, which will assist in developing an HSEEP consistent exercise program. This course describes a common approach to exercise program management, design and development, conduct, evaluation, and improvement planning.
