Group Crisis Intervention

The "Group Crisis Intervention" training program is designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum. The two day course prepares participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services including pre and post incident crisis education, significant other support services, on-scene support services, crisis intervention for individuals, Demobilizations after large scale traumatic incidents, small group defusings and the group intervention known as Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD).

The "Group Crisis Intervention" course specifically prepares participants to provide several of these interventions; specifically: demobilizations, defusings and the CISD. The need for appropriate follow up services and referrals when necessary is also described. Considerable evidence gathered to date strongly supports the multi-component crisis intervention strategy, which is discussed in this course. The "Group Crisis Intervention" course is designed to specifically teach crisis intervention and Emergency Mental Health skills such as demobilizations, defusing and CISD. At the completion of this course, participants will be able to: Define stress, CISD, and PTSD; list the 10 basic interventions of CISM; and define and describe in detail the CISM group processes of Demobilizations, Defusings and Debriefings.
