

Senior Vice President and Chief of Acute Care Surgery Grady Memorial Hospital Professor of Surgery, Emory University and Moorehouse School of Medicine



Nationally renowned trauma surgeon Dr. Peter Rhee is currently Grady Memorial Hospital's new Chief of Acute Care Surgery and Medical Director of the Marcus Trauma Center in Atlanta, Georgia. Prior to his move to Atlanta he worked at the University of Arizona where he served as Chief of

Trauma, Critical Care, Burn and Emergency Surgery and was a professor of surgery.

A 1983 summa cum laude graduate of Georgia Tech with a Bachelor of Science in Health System Engineering, Dr. Rhee received his medical degree from Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, Bethesda, Maryland. He holds a Masters of Public Health from the University of Washington and a diploma in the Medical Care of Catastrophes from the Society of Apothecaries of London. Dr. Rhee completed a fellowship in trauma and critical care at the University of Washington's Harborview Medical Center and is double boarded in general surgery and surgical critical care.
